Section 4. First aid measures

Section 6. Accidental release measures

Section 7. Handling and storage

- Handling** : Avoid creating dusty conditions and prevent wind dispersal. Avoid all possible sources of ignition (spark or flame). Avoid contamination by any source including metals, dust and organic materials.
- Storage** : Store and use away from heat, sparks, open flame or any other ignition source. Avoid contact with combustible materials. Prevent moisture pick-up in handling and storage.

Section 8. Exposure controls/personal protection

- Engineering controls** : Use only with adequate ventilation. If user operations generate dust, fumes, gas, vapor or mist, use process enclosures, local exhaust ventilation or other engineering controls to keep worker exposure to airborne contaminants below any recommended or statutory limits.

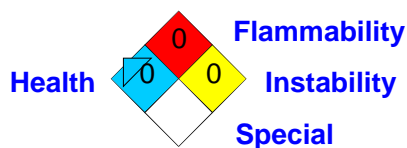
